Addendum & Amendment to Sailing Instructions Number 1

10 March 2010

1.1. CLASS SPLITS FOR IRC

The class splits for IRC classes will be as follows:

- IRC Class 1** TCC **1.075 and above**, including RCC triallists as at paragraph 1.4 below.
- IRC Class 2** TCC **1.030 to 1.074**, plus RCC triallists as at paragraph 1.4 below.
- IRC Class 3** TCC **0.955 to 1.029**.
- IRC Class 4** TCC **0.954 and below**.

It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure that his boat races in the right class according to the published rating splits and notes above. Any listing published by the race committee does not change that responsibility.

Boats in IRC4 are reminded of the start time of 1000 each week from the Warsash Laser Race Control line which uses VHF channel M2 – see SI 5.

1.2 J/92 CLASS

A **separate class** is now being provided for J/92s (boats certified by J-Boats as being a J/92 or J/92 S). The class will race under IRC ratings and subject to IRC rules. It will start at the same time as the J/105 class and sail the same course but be scored separately. The class flag for the J/92 class is the same as for the J/105 class: international code flag "J".

1.3 STARTING ORDER

Black group Classes on the **Warsash Black Race Control start line** will be started in the following order, and the intended start times are shown. This changes Black Group SI 7.2.

1.4 ROLEX COMMODORES' CUP TRIALLISTS

All boats that are triallists for the Rolex Commodore's Cup 2010 (RCC) shall notify the Race Committee of that fact.

All triallists for classes 1 and 2 of the RCC shall race in IRC Class 1 at a minimum rating of 1.075.

All triallists for class 3 of the RCC shall race in IRC Class 2 at their official rating.

Crew Numbers: For the Warsash Spring Championship, triallists for the RCC shall comply with the crew number limits set out in Paragraph 11 of the RCC Notice of Race.

IRC classes: It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure that his boat races in the right class according to the published rating splits and notes. If the rating is not known to the race committee when initial class lists are published, it may make a guess at the class the boat should be in, but if that guess is wrong it is still the competitor's responsibility to get it right. Competitors are urged not to spoil their whole series by starting in the wrong class.

Provisional results will also be emailed to those who give us their email addresses, and placed on the website on Sunday evening.
